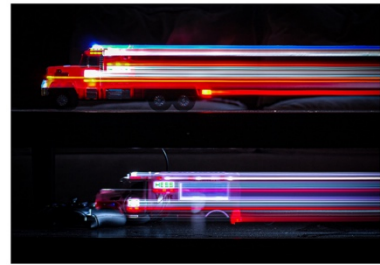

**Through Our Eyes X** is New Canaan High School's 10th Annual Art Exhibition at the Carriage Barn Arts Center. This exhibition features the artwork of NCHS's students from grades 9 - 12, in all media from a wide range of Art elective courses offered at NCHS. These courses include Drawing, Painting, Printmaking, Mixed Media Design, Photography,

Photoshop, Advanced Digital Media, Studio Art, AP Studio Art, Jewelry, Ceramics, and Filmmaking.

New Canaan High School Art Department is directed by Alan Sneath and led by Art teachers Jennifer Sinski, Kimanne Core and Maggie Pennoyer. It is a high-level exhibition. As an affiliate of the National Scholastic Art Awards and The Alliance for Young Artists and Writers, the Connecticut region is proud to continue an annual tradition established in 1927. This national program was originated to honor the creative efforts of grade 7 to 12 students in public, private and parochial schools. It is now the largest and most senior program of its type in the country.
